Current volunteer opportunities include volunteering with the Conservation Team or in the Front Office and Gift Shop.



The clocks have changed, Hallowe'en is past and now we are sliding into the serious winter months. Maybe we'll have sunshine one day but it's likely to be rain the next. In the Gardens we need to wear gumboots more often than not and it's hard not to leave soggy footprints across the lawns.

Mostly the flowers are gone but the colours and the textures of the foliage seem even more varied than in midsummer. The maples are magnificent. There are several striking examples in the Takata Garden, low-spreading crimson ones on the banks of the stream and another, Acer palmatum 'Shishigashira', standing over the upper pond, which is a most gorgeous blend of yellow, orange and rust brown. However much I adjust my camera or try at

different times of the day, I seem unable to really capture its full rich colour; up close it looks truly good enough to eat.

In the Fusion Garden there is an as yet small variety, Acer palmatum 'Crimson Queen', whose red coloration is quite stunning. This cultivar is supposed to grow up to ten feet tall so, given its already spectacular display, we can hope to enjoy an increasingly outstanding specimen in the coming years.



Although most of the popular fruits are now picked or fallen there are still some tree fruits that are looking extremely appealing. In the Permaculture Garden there is a persimmon (Diospyros kika) whose leaves are fallen but the fruit themselves are clinging on, looking like so many bright orange tomatoes. And not far away the quince (Cydonia oblonga) is still bearing plenty of its large yellow pear-shaped fruit on its branches though the ground

beneath is also littered with many more. It is perhaps unfortunate that they are so disagreeable to taste when fresh but the effort of cooking them is rewarding. Peeling and coring them is indeed a little tough but once they are simmering in the pan the flesh turns progressively from yellow to orange and then rose-pink before becoming a gorgeous scarlet, quite the equal of any maple. And the resultant quince jelly or candied quince butter (membrillo) is a seasonal treat that you won't forget.



In the Hardy Borders the purple leaf barberry (Berberis thunbergii var. atropurpurea) stands out loud and proud and in the Lily Garden the camellia is showing some early blooms. In a couple of spots marigolds (Calendula officinalis) still offer splashes of orange so bright that they seem almost out of place and in the Winter Garden there are still one or two purple geraniums. But what I find particularly appealing in this somewhat variable season are the textures and silvery-greys of the plants of the lower border of the Drought Tolerant Garden. At the eastern end Phlomis italica stands softly upright beside the spikey green and yellow spears of Yucca filamentosa 'Bright Edge'. Then the tall grey-green of Euphorbia characias ssp. wulfenii is neighbour to the ground-covering Donkey-tail Spurge (Euphorbia myrsinites) whose spiralling geometric forms have a look almost of sea creatures. Further along two lavenders, Lavandula stoechas and L. dentata, have attractive winter foliage despite their lack of flowers and Erigeron 'Profusion' makes up for that, sitting between them and still bearing its little white daisies.



In the summer months one is endlessly distracted by the profusion of flowers but this quieter time gives one an opportunity to appreciate some of the less flamboyant shades and contours around the paths and beds of the HCP.

The part-time Level 3 students began classes on October 30 and will complete their studies on December 8th right before we set off for holidays. With graduation on November 17, the 2023 full-time certificate students are finishing up major assignments in Plant ID, Landscape Design and Hardscaping.

Thriving Student Projects

The heart of any horticulture college lies in the innovative projects of its students, and PHC is no exception. Our dedicated students have been busy cultivating a wide variety of landscape design projects complete with detailed graphics and renderings, considering plant choices and placement, in addition to design solutions and meeting the clients' needs. These beautiful final projects will be on display in our Couvelier Pavilion over Graduation.

Workshops

Pacific Horticulture College will be facilitating an Instructional Skills Workshop for future and current instructors. This 4 day workshop is designed to enhance teaching effectiveness for new and experienced educators. Participants actively engage with colleagues when receiving and sharing lesson feedback to enhance their teaching and student learning. This class is encouraged for all teachers in a college setting by our regulating body; The Private Institution Training Branch. All sessions are held at the Gardens at HCP in the classroom building and the fee is also provided at a discounted rate.

PHC College places great importance on community engagement and service. This semester, our students are involved in several local projects, including volunteering at community and classroom gardens, specifically the Individual Learning Centre and Rain Garden during the first recovery phase of the project. The impact was immense and our PHC instructors provided wonderful support during the hours spent on site. These efforts not only give back to the community but also provide valuable hands-on experience for our students.


