

## **Chinook Beefsteak**

**Indeterminate (Vine)**

80 days to maturity



Chinook is a beautiful burgundy ox-heart with rich and sweet flavour along with a velvety smooth texture bred by Karen Olivier in Canada, part of her True North Series. It's an indeterminate, regular-leaf plant known for its rich, smooth flavour and burgundy-purple color. Chinook is a popular choice for those who enjoy meaty, heart-shaped tomatoes for slicing and fresh eating.

## **Cinnamon Girl**

**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



Developed by **Karen Olivier** from Northern Gardener, Cinnamon Girl is a promising new tomato variety noted for its exceptional flavour and productivity.

Cinnamon Girl features indeterminate potato leaf plants with long, straight trusses that often develop into double clusters, enhancing productivity. It reaches maturity midseason.

This variety produces large cherry tomatoes with a rich, dark cinnamon brown color. Cinnamon Girl offers a sweet, rich, and complex flavour.

## **Cowboy**

**Indeterminate (Vine)**

80 days to maturity



One slice covers a slice of homemade bread. Delicious, beautiful, rusty brown fruits hang on vining plants. Another **Karen Olivier** variety, Cowboy was named for her late father, Harold Borle. This one feels like a family heirloom already.

**Karma Peach**  
**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



Karma Peach cocktail tomatoes are bicolour fruits of varying size from a large cocktail fruit to a mini beefsteak. All are worthy of fresh slicing for snacking and salads. Karma Peach grows on vining potato leaf plants.

These indeterminate (vining and bearing fruit continuously, until the frosts), require trellis support. Vining tomatoes are a great way to get lots of fruit in small growing spaces.



**Karma Pink**  
**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



KARMA Pink is a potato leaf very large cherry, producing dark pink fruits. Potato Leaf cherries are very rare. So sweet, we call them garden candy. Deep raspberry pink in color with thin skins. It is very disease resistant and produced abundantly in our cooler region. Exceptional taste and resisted cracking. We highly recommend this new open pollinated cherry for those that want a sweet pink cherry and also save seed.

*“Features of all the Karmas: bred by **Karen Olivier**. All are vigorous and healthy indeterminate potato leaf plants, All are different but all have excellent flavour. Thin skins, cautious watering and picking blushing fruit promptly is recommended. Rare colours and sizes in potato leaf plants. All have a recessive clear epidermis. All are midseason in maturity. All have meaty interiors that give them the texture of a larger tomato. Big flavour, small tomatoes.” – Karen Olivier*

**Karma Purple**  
**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



This is one of the results of the KARMA project. A collaboration between Canadian breeder Karen Olivier and Marsha Eisenberg of Florida. Working together, they did grow out of a cross between Ambrosia Gold Cherry X Captain Lucky.

KARMA Purple is a potato leaf cherry, producing dark purple fruits. So sweet, we call them garden candy. Deep purple in color with the green shoulders often seen in purple/black tomatoes. It is very disease resistant and produced abundantly in our cooler region. Exceptional taste and resisted cracking.

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**Nightingale**  
**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



Nightingale Indeterminate cherry tomatoes are ivory yellow cocktail cherry tomatoes on prolific, vining potato leaf plants. Fruits hang neatly on short trusses. These ivory yellow fruits are called “white” in the tomato world. This is the only white cherry, potato leaf variety we know of. Flavour is sweet, crisp and fruity. The closest thing to a grape I’ve tasted! These indeterminate (vining and bearing fruit continuously, until the frosts), require trellis support. Vining tomatoes are a great way to get lots of fruit in small growing spaces.

“The Story behind the “Nightingale” tomato.

## Oh Canada

### Indeterminate (vine)

70 - 80 days to maturity from transplant



Oh Canada is another distinguished offering from **Karen Olivier**, the innovative force behind Northern Gardener. Named to evoke national pride, its large, bright red, slightly flattened beefsteaks capture the essence of the Canadian maple leaf.

Oh Canada features vigorous, indeterminate vines with potato leaf foliage, designed for robust growth and midseason maturity.

The beefsteaks of Oh Canada boast a beautiful interior and an enhanced sweet, classic tomato flavour. Their intense red color and slightly flattened shape add to their visual appeal. Oh Canada offers a sweeter taste than typical red tomatoes, providing a rich tomato experience that is perfect for those who savour enhanced flavours.

Oh Canada's vigorous growth ensures a bountiful production of large, sweet beefsteaks. With a prolonged productive cycle, gardeners can expect a plentiful harvest throughout the growing season.



**One Trick Pony**  
**Indeterminate (Vine)**  
days to maturity



One Trick Pony is another exquisite innovation from **Karen Olivier (Northern Gardener)**. This variety is named to highlight its singular, standout quality, featuring large, dusky purple beefsteaks that captivate both the eye and the palate with a meaty burgundy interior complemented by unique green gel, providing both visual appeal and delicious taste. The skin, a deep dusky purple bordering on black, adds dramatic flair to its presentation.

One Trick Pony boasts vigorous, indeterminate vines with regular leaf foliage. This variety is designed for robust growth, achieving full maturity midseason. With its vigorous growth habit, One Trick Pony ensures a consistent and generous production of large, flavourful beefsteaks. Gardeners can look forward to a productive season with this midseason variety, which promises an abundant harvest throughout the growing period.

## Taiga

indeterminate (vine)

65 to 70 days to maturity from transplant



Taiga is part of **Karen Olivier's** "True North" series of ox-heart tomatoes bred for a combination of cool season production, beautiful and unusual bi-color appearance, and, most importantly, flavour.

Taiga has an unusual beauty, green streaked with bronze and red, cut to reveal flesh with a marbling of more of the same but with even more intensified colours. The flavour is 10/10, with a balanced combination of sweetness, richness, and depth. The meaty flesh has very few seeds or gel cavities and is equally at home sliced for a sandwich or cooked to passata.

Potato leaf plants produce quite large fruits with minimal cracking.

Ox-heart types grow differently than many of our favorite tomatoes and require a different strategy to maximize harvests. Rather than a strong central stem and abundant foliage that lends itself to more common two-leader pruning and "florida weave" style trellising, most ox-hearts display slender willowy leaders, sparse leaf coverage, and many suckers that we only very minimally prune in order to prevent sun scald and maximize fruit yield.



## **Tundra**

**indeterminate (vine)**

65 to 70 days to maturity from transplant



Another heart shaped beauty from Canadian breeder **Karen Olivier** in her True North series.

A large potato leaf meaty purple heart. No core and very few seeds. Deep, oaky mellow flavour. It's like a fine glass of wine this one. Grab some thick bread and some cheese and you have a meal. Intense purple interior with clear skin. Most average 8-14 oz. Perfect sauce tomato or fresh eating.
